

Meeting Minutes
February 21, 2022

Evening Program: The program this evening was presented by Nathan Mattison of Mattison and Son sewing machine repair, alterations and quilting. He told the group that one of the first things to do when you begin sewing is to check your needle and it should be changed for every 8 hours of sewing you do. The next thing is to check the bobbin area. Remove the bobbin case and clean out any lint or build up and then check the spring. The bobbin area is a very common area for thread and lint build up creating tension issues. When cleaning, NEVER use canned air; use a vacuum. Canned air can drive particles

deeper into the machine which will then require a tech to get to. Another very common problem which causes big problems is thread wrapped up in the take-up arm. This is caused when changing thread and pulling the thread out in reverse rather than cutting on top and pulling it out through the needle. Another important thing is to be sure to match thread to size of needle.

Finally, a question was asked about featherweights and Nate said that old Featherweights or Singer should not have their foot pedals left plugged in as there is electricity always running through it.

MARCH WORKSHOP AND PROGRAM

For the workshop on March 21, we will be making the Rocky Mountain Bear Claw table runner. The Rocky Mountain Bear Claw is a fun design for the confident beginner to advanced quilter. A sewing technique called foundation paper piecing is used to assemble

the units required to make a 72"x21" table runner or you can make 2 smaller table runners. Curved piecing is used to join the units after the foundation piecing is completed. Donna Mather is the instructor and she is a Certified Instructor with Quiltworx and is coming from Waunakee, WI. The workshop is \$45 and the pattern is \$26, payable to the guild. Please let me know asap if you have not signed up yet and plan to attend.

She will also be doing the program for that night, "An Introduction to Judy Niemeyer Quilting." She will present a trunk show of her amazing collection of breathtaking Judy Niemeyer quilts. Donna will include some of the techniques used in a presentation to inspire quilters from beginners to advanced to create their own heirloom quilts using the Judy Niemeyer Foundation Paper Piecing method.
