

Meeting Minutes
May 16, 2022

Barb Gaertner opened the meeting at 6:30 pm by turning the meeting over to Shauna Heck to introduce the program for the evening. Judy Hasheider from Quilt with Judy presented a trunk show titled "Oh! the Possibilities!" Judy shows ways to make your quilt your own, giving you permission to change things up a bit. Even a purchased pattern can become more interesting with some small additions.

The Business meeting was called to order by Barb Gaertner at 8:05 pm.

Barb welcomed our visitors: Jennifer Newmer, Jeanne Almasy, Gloria Basista, Margaret deLeon, Starr Pittaway, Christy Kuntzelman, Karen Fyock.

Name Tag drawing went to Deb Ley and Show 'n Tell went to Ruth Whitney.

Secretary Minutes: There were no additions or corrections identified for Secretary's Minutes of the April meeting. Kay Walker made a motion to approve the meeting minutes as presented, Ann Tully seconded the motion, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Dawn Vehmeier summarized the information reported in the Newsletter. The Treasurer's Report will be filed for annual audit by the Executive Board.

Kathy Clark reported on the fundraising for Pegasus Special Riders conducted during the Show by offering Orphan Blocks donated by the members for a donation to Pegasus. Kathy reported 220 blocks were donated, only 42 remained at the end of the show (these will be put into charity quilts for the Guild).

Newsletter: Mary Meier reported for the newsletter all is good.

Committee Reports

Program Committee: Shauna Heck, Program Chair, announced next month's program will be titled "I Shrunk the Flower" by Eileen Daniels. Techniques taught will be solvron shrinking, braid gathering, thread and fabric dye painting, water coloring with pencils, yoyo's yarn couching and thread painting. Workshop fee is \$25 Eileen's evening program will be a trunk show titled "Orphan Block Trunk Show."

Bee: Beekeepers are Kay Walker, Faye Schneiderman and Nina Mueller. They spent some time brainstorming ideas to get more participation at the Bee Sewing time. June's plan will involve Red, White, & Blue theme. More information will be sent out before the June date.

Old Business:

The Executive Board held a meeting to revisit all the proposed changes that were discussed at this meeting. After reviewing the original proposal some of the changes were modified. A latest version, dated 5/10/22, was sent to the membership via email. Barb opened the floor for discussion on the proposed changes. No comments or questions came from the membership. Nina Mueller made a motion to close the discussion, Kathy Clark seconded it. A vote on a revision to the Guild's Constitution and Bylaws dated 5/10/22 will be taken at the June Guild meeting.

Ann Tully reported that Bunny Weisendanger received the raffle quilt she won in our Raffle drawing and was so very thrilled to have won it. Bunny was part of the group who pieced the quilt and has since moved out of the area. She says this is a wonderful way she has of remembering all the members of the Guild she misses seeing.

New Business:

A reminder to all that an officer election is soon approaching. Nominations will be sought. All were reminded that we all “need to take a turn” (maybe another “turn”) in the leadership of our Guild.

There is also discussion of re-instituting the Warmups & Demos we used to have. In the past this was part of Program Committee. Two additional leaders were identified to schedule Warmups & Demos by securing volunteers from the membership, then moved up to Program Chair the following year.

Adjournment: Motion to adjourn the business meeting was made at 8:30 pm by Chyree Lincoln, 2nd by Kathy Clark. Motion carried. The adjournment was followed by Show ‘n Tell by several members.
