

CCQG, Meeting Minutes
MARCH 2025

Program: Quilt Guild member Jeannie Brinkmeier delivered a great program she called Alterations, Tips and Tools. Jeannie has been sewing for many years starting at the age of six. She explained her journey and how it progressed through the stages of making her own clothing when she was young to altering wedding gowns and now quilting. Along with the work she does on bridal gowns including vintage restoration, she also does alterations for prom, tailoring, home decor and offers sewing classes for adults and children. She discussed how alterations have evolved through the years, gave advice when ordering a dress and showed slides of some of the dresses she has reconstructed. At the end of the program, she shared some of the tools that she likes and how we can use them. It was a great presentation.

After a short break, the meeting was called to order by President Jennifer Newcomer at 8:23 pm. There were 32 members present.

Members were asked to present projects for show and tell.

Joyce Meyer from Forreston joined us tonight as a visitor.

Volunteers are needed to help with presentations on Friday and Saturday, white gloves, and to work the boutique. Shauna explained how the show would be laid out.

The Quilt Raffle drawing will be held Saturday at 2:00. Kathy Clark said that raffle ticket sales are going well.

Old Business The shelf in the storeroom has been installed and it is much more organized. Ruth Whitney mentioned that there are storage bins for financial records and historical items that should be sorted through.

The calling tree has now been closed as everyone on it agreed to receive alerts by email.

Service Project Chairman Doreen Hartman will be reaching out to different facilities in the area to see what items are needed so we can decide what to make.

Donalee Yenney made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Kathy Clark seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 9:04.


Quilt Show – Raffle Tickets Distribution





General Notes and Reminders
