

TREASURERS REPORT

CCQG, Meeting Minutes **APRIL 21, 2025**

Program: Our program titled “Grandma’s Apron” was presented by Kris Winkler and Lynn Lokken from Monroe, WI. They have an extensive collection of aprons which were presented in a lively and entertaining program. Aprons through the ages, in many construction methods and materials, each presented with its particular historical reference. They definitely have a passion for this collection; they have over 300 aprons!

After a short refreshment break, the meeting was called to order by President Jennifer Newcomer at 8:23 pm. There were 25 members present.

Margaret Rominski made a motion to accept the minutes in the April Newsletter and Dawn Vehmeier seconded. Motion approved.

The Treasurer’s Report, as it appeared in the April newsletter, was reviewed, and will be held for audit by the Executive Board.

Programs: Kay Walker discussed the next 2 programs. May will feature Mary Alice Hart who will do a workshop called Scrappy Play and an evening program called Trash to Treasure. In June, Jill Shaulis from Yellow Creek Design will present a trunk show plus a workshop for that day is being planned. More details are pending.

Kay is seeking a potential Chairperson for Programs for 2026. She is willing to pair up to assist the new Program Chair, sharing her contacts and approach to finding potential programs. Also no one has stepped up to function as Warm Up Chairperson, which in the past has been a successful starting point for Program Chair in the year following. Shauna Heck thanked everyone for their help with putting on our Quilt Show – all the volunteers for the days of the Show plus all the preparation for the Show. Collective opinion was that this was a very successful show, many favorable comments were reported. She recognized Rhonda Streich for making the Quilt ribbons and all her help with the setup.

Shauna reported on some early details from the Quilt Show. Attendance for Friday was estimated at 850 and for Saturday 505. There were nine vendors at the Show: all expressed thanks for the opportunity to join us. They were also appreciative of lunch being provided.

The Boutique income was reported at xxx. Also, members who contributed items to the Boutique received a drawing ticket for items donated with the opportunity to win the prize of one year membership. Shauna did the drawing at this meeting; Donalee Yenney was the winner.

Many compliments were received relative to the venue. They liked the layout particularly.

Shauna reported total fee for the facility was xxx.

She shared a letter from the Quilt of Valor recipient. He was very appreciative of this recognition.

Old Business

Ruth Whitney reported on the review of old records held in storage in our space in the "closet." Today the financial records tub was reviewed. All materials older than 2015 were identified to be shredded. It was available to review prior to the meeting. There were no objections to this, so they would be destroyed. In the future the tub containing history records will be reviewed.

New Business

Ruth Whitney reported a new location for storage of the Quilt Show wooden rack system was needed. A 10 x 10 unit was located in Shannon and a month-by-month rental agreement was signed. Next the Executive Board will be reviewing the budget situation to see how/where in the budget we will be able to absorb the added expense of xxx per month for this storage. If any member has an available inside space available and would be willing to store these items, please let us know. Other options to be considered include dues increase, other fundraisers, or member assessment.

Rhonda Streich announced a new activity she will be introducing next month. She is designing a Mystery Quilt for the Guild members. It will be a six-month mystery, starting in May, ending in October. This is open to all members, at your option and at no cost. It will be a two-color design: color your choice, recommending high contrast colors. Each month, at 6:30, prior to our Program, she will provide the clue and a

demonstration of its construction. In October she will present the final clue and will reveal the quilt. This final clue will be the instruction for the final quilt top.

Dawn Vehmeier reported on a request from the Freeport YMCA for a donation of a quilt that might be used in a Silent Auction Fundraiser on May 8. Anyone interested in donating a quilt please contact Dawn after the meeting.

President Jennifer Newcomer recognized our April Birthday Members: Chyree Rohde-Lincoln, Elizabeth Fabian, Donalee Yenney.

Treasurer Donalee Yenney indicated that we had not formally approved the 2025 Budget at the March meeting. This was missed at tonight's meeting so will be held over for May in Old Business.

No additional business was introduced. Shauna Heck made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Kathy Clark seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm. Show & Tell followed adjournment.


