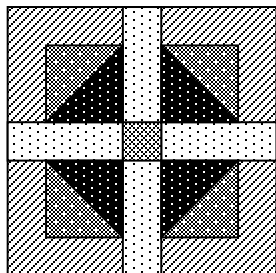

Meeting Minutes for CCQG meeting
10/20/25.

Following the evening program presented by Lisa Furleigh of Quilting in the Valley and our refreshments, President Jennifer Newcomer gathered the group together to get started.

VP Mary Pizzolato announced the winners of tonight's drawings: Show & Tell: Teri Janecek; Nametag: Joyce Winnekins; Mystery Quilt: Peggy Wohlford.

She also reported that 36 members were in attendance plus 2 Guests, both from Byron: Cindy McIntyre and Judy Ferolie.

Jennifer then called for any Show & Tell presenters.

The business meeting was then called to order at 8:45 pm.

Review of the October Newsletter: one item was identified as item within the Treasurer's Report, which seemed to be missing a check number. This will be verified with the Treasurer and corrected for the record.

There were no additions or correction to the meeting minutes as reported within the Newsletter. Peggy Wohlford made a motion to accept the minutes as presented; Shauna Heck seconded the motion; motion passed.

Regarding the Treasurer's report, Jennifer asked if there were any bills to present to the Treasurer. Hearing none, she stated that this report would be held over for the annual audit by the Executive Board.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Kay Walker, Program Chair, reported on the November meeting activity would be our

annual Holiday Potluck. Jeannine Price and Liz Fabian are co-chairing this event. They requested 4 volunteers to sign up to provide a meat dish; volunteers were identified. The remaining membership was asked to bring a dish to pass. Jeannine and Liz are planning some games following the meal.

Kay reported on the Pocket Pillow project which was part of the Bee activity today. We were very pleased with Bee activity; participants completed 35 pillows. (Subsequent to the meeting Ruth Whitney inventoried all the pillows turned in at this meeting and reported 99 total were collected.) Final date for submitting any pillows will be the November meeting. Several local organizations are being contacted for potential recipients of the pillows, including DCFS, Hope House (Rochelle), Voices (Freeport), etc. Final distribution plan will be presented at the November business meeting. Kay also reported that Vicky Dose has stepped forward to volunteer on the Program Committee with Kay. Doreen Hartman/Nina Mueller, Charity Committee, are planning various projects for our charity work plus the 2027 Quilt Show Boutique. They are planning to announce monthly projects and will utilize the Bee time for workshops.

Jennifer thanked Karen Bolen for volunteering to share a Warm Up this evening before the program. She encouraged others to think of something they could share with the group in this format.
